



DAY TIME

- · Stay indoor.
- Stay away from balconies and refrain from going on rooftops.
- In case you are inside a vehicle, park the vehicle and take shelter in nearby buildings, underpasses or underground parkings.

When alert is on, siren shall go on for 5 minutes, once the alert is off, the siren shall be sounded for one minute

NIGHT TIME

In addition to precautions during day time, also do the following:

- Switch off the lights immediately.
- Close windows and draw thick curtains. Ensure no light escapes outdoors.
- Make sure that automatic generator/ inverter lights are also off.
- Any light which is automatic on solar power or so, must be disconnected in advance so that it does not turn on during blackout.
- Residents should avoid using mobile phones, flashlights, or any lightemitting devices in open areas.
- In case you are inside vehicle, park the vehicle and switch off lights immediately

District RYLA chair Dr. Sanjay Kalra apprised the participants of the various avenues that open up by participating in




the youth services under Rotary and specially RYLA.


