

Rotary leaders and peace enthusiasts and over 500 students gathered at Chandigarh University for the Rotary Peace Summit. In his welcome address Pro Vice Chancellor of the University, Prof (Dr) Devinder Singh commended the Rotarians for

coming together to motivate the generation next to plant the seeds of peace and foster in them the spirit of approaching conflict

resolution with positivity, which is crucial for today's youth.

Rotary District Governor Rajpal Singh, underlined Rotary's



commitment to world peace through humanitarian service projects, youth exchange initiatives to encourage people-to-people contacts, and learn to build bridges of goodwill and harmony in the community. Rotary, he said, had been instrumental in formation of the United Nations citizen, and must become the solutionoriented focus of our drawing room discussions, she said.

Chief guest Manraj Grewal, resident editor of Indian Express cited examples of Nelson Mandela and Mahatma Gandhi to put forward the importance of keeping peace in focus. She elaborated extensively on the concept of Peace and its potential to be integrated into our educational systems, praising Chandigarh University for collaborating with Rotarians in this initiative.

Rotary District Peace Chair Rtn. AP Singh Dhiman informed that this is the second of the series of similar summits to be held in various parts of the Rotary District 3080 this year, under the aegis of the Rotary Action Group for Peace (RAGFP) India Chapter. He urged the youth to understand positive peace and to take meaningful steps toward a more peaceful world, one project, one conversation, and one act of kindness at a time.
